

#### Introduction

#### Location

Brighton is located in Essex County in the heart of Vermont's Northeast Kingdom, roughly 16 miles south of the Canadian border and 10 miles West of the New Hampshire border. Brighton is intersected by state routes 105, 114 and 111. Brighton is about an hour and 45 minute drive from Montpelier and over 2 hours' drive from Burlington. Newport is about 40 minutes away and Saint Johnsbury is under an hour away.

Neighboring towns include Morgan, Warren Gore, and Avery's Gore to the North; Lewis and Ferdinand to the East, Newark to the South, and Westmore and Charleston to the West.

#### From the Brighton Town Website

"Brighton is a small, picturesque town in rural Essex County, Vermont. Within Brighton, the village of Island Pond serves the community as an economic center, as it has throughout Brighton's history. Situated halfway between Portland, Maine and Montreal, Quebec, Brighton was once a thriving railroad town."

"The village of Island Pond is situated along the shores of the similarly named 600-acre lake with a 22-acre island.

"The Town was organized in 1832. There is an historical marker in Island Pond noting that the village is the meeting place of the first international railroad. One end of the railroad was started in Portland and the other in Montreal, and they met in Island Pond in 1853."

"While the railroad remains a key economic factor for the Town today, tourism has come to play an important part in the economy. Brighton is a small rural town blessed with striking natural beauty and an abundance of natural resources that have benefited residents and attracted visitors for many years. It is also known for its extensive snowmobile trail system."






#### Age Groups: 2000 & 2010



# Percent of Population over 16 Years of Age in the Labor Force



#### Brighton Labor Force, Inflow & Outflow (Full and Part Time Jobs)\*

The following is a visual representation of 2013 worker Inflow & Outflow data presented in the accompanying table. \*Some types of jobs are not able to be included in this analysis, including sole proprietorships and government employees.



In 2013 there were 215 full and part time jobs in Brighton, a negligible decrease from 221 jobs in 2003. 141 of these jobs were filled by commuters into town and 74 Brighton jobs were filled by Brighton residents. A total of 567 full and part time jobs (in or out of Brighton) were filled by Brighton residents in 2013, up 66% from 342 jobs filled by Brighton residents a decade earlier.
