
# Vermont Climate Economy Summit IDEAS TO ACTION

Thank you for attending VCRD's Vermont Climate Economy Summit: IDEAS to ACTION.

At last year's February Summit on "Creating Prosperity and Opportunity Confronting Climate Change," over 400 Vermonters shared their ideas on the ways that focused action around energy development, efficiencies, transportation renewal, waste recovery and many other arenas could significantly boost businesses and jobs for the future. Morning sessions will include panelists in crucial roles from state leaders to mayors, investors and students who will share their stories and perspectives on elements in the



### Meet Keynote Speaker: Danny Kennedy



Danny Kennedy, an internationally recognized opinion leader on climate and energy issues, is the author of Rooftop Revolution: How Solar Power Can Save Our Economy – and the Planet – From Dirty Energy (2012) and is Managing Director of CalCEF, a team of leading financial professionals, entrepreneurs, policy-makers, and scientists with deep experience and expertise in the clean energy field. He also serves as President of CalCharge, a groundbreaking public-private partnership working to accelerate the development, commercialization, and adoption of new energy storage technologies. Kennedy worked as a cofounder of Sungevity, Inc., the largest privately held solar company in the US and also co-founded SfunCube, the only incubator and accelerator solely focused on supporting solar entrepreneurs to succeed. In 2011, he earned the PBS Innovator of the Year award for "moving the planet forward."

#### William Belongia, Executive Director, Vermont

Community Loan Fund | Will has served as the Executive Director of the VCLF since 2004 and as Chief Financial Officer for 11 years before that. Will earned a B.A. in Economics from University of Notre Dame, holds an M.B.A. from UVM, and is an alumnus of the Snelling Center for Government's Vermont Leadership Institute. Will serves on multiple boards including: CEI Capital Management, Vermont Rural Ventures, Working Lands Enterprise Board, Vermont Housing & Conservation Board's Housing Preservation Council, GMP Renewable Development Fund, Slow Money Vermont, and Building Bright Futures Facility Fund.

**Kathy Beyer**, *Vice President for Development, Housing Vermont* | Over the past 20 years, Ms. Beyer has been directly involved in housing development including new construction, historic rehabilitation, downtown and village centers, and preservation of at-risk housing. She originally joined Housing Vermont in 1990. She served in the VT Legislature in the mid-90s and also as Deputy Commissioner of the VT Department of Housing & Community Affairs where she provided policy and management oversight in housing, land use planning, historic preservation and community development. She returned to Housing Vermont in 2007. Ms. Beyer holds an M.P.A. degree from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University and a B.S. Degree in Accounting & Economics from the University of Minnesota.

Rosalea W." Jo" Bradley, Chief Executive Officer,

Vermont Economic Development Authority | From 1997 to
the present, Ms. Bradley has been the Chief Executive Officer for
VEDA, the State of Vermont's Economic Development Finance
Authority which has over \$230 million in assets. Previously, she was
the Deputy Secretary and Chief Operating Officer for the VT Agency
of Commerce and Community Development. Ms. Bradley holds an
MBA from Boston University and completed the Program for Senior
Executives at the John F. Kennedy School at Harvard University. She
lives in South Burlington, Vermont.

Sen. Christopher A. Bray, Vermont State Senator |
Senator Bray, of New Haven, became a member of the Vermont
House of Representatives in January 2007, serving two terms on the
House Agriculture Committee. Chris received a BA in Zoology and
MA in English from UVM and taught there for four years in the
English Department. He is an alumnus of the Snelling Center for
Government's Vermont Leadership Institute. Chris founded and still

operates Common Ground Communications, which provides writing, editing and production services to technical clients and the book publishing industry. Chris and his family operate an 82-acre farm in New Haven. In 2009, Chris was elected to the Board of Trustees of UVM and received VNRC's Legislative Leadership Award. In 2010, Chris received the Council of State Government's Toll Fellowship. In 2012, Chris was appointed to the VT Supreme Court's Professional Responsibility Program.

Chris Brooks, Co-Founder and CEO of the Vermont Wood Pellet Company | Chris is passionate about the sustainable use of forestry resources, and he brings those concepts with him to this venture. Previous to the formation of the Vermont Wood Pellet Company, Chris worked as a hands-on consultant, hired to develop and expand business strategies for many companies over the last 25 years. Chris grew up in rural Minnesota and Wisconsin where five generations of family lumber interests contrasted sharply with his father's regional presidency of the Sierra Club. This early influence taught Chris to find common ground from which to work toward a sustainable solution.

**Greg Brown**, Board Chair, Vermont Council on Rural

Development | Greg has worked in regional and state planning in

Vermont for 35 years. Greg began his career with the Windham Regional Planning Commission and then served as Director of Planning for the VT Department of Housing and Community Affairs where he administered state programs supporting local and regional planning. In 1998 he was appointed Commissioner of Housing and Community Affairs where he played a major role in crafting the Vermont Downtown Program. Greg currently devotes volunteer time to the Vermont Council for Rural Development and, to the Windham Regional Commission. He lives in Dummerston with his wife Carolyn.

position as Director of the Agency's Policy, Planning and Intermodal
Development Division. Previous to his work at the Agency of
Transportation, he was the General Manager at the Chittenden
County Transportation Authority; was employed by the VT
Legislature as a Fiscal Analyst at the Joint Fiscal Office; and at the
New York State Legislature, Office of Program and Counsel, as a
Policy Analyst for the Transportation, Education, and Environmental
Conservation Committees.

Andrea Colnes, Executive Director, Energy Action Network | Energy Action Network is a systems-based effort to transform Vermont's energy economy to one based on efficiency and renewables. Prior to joining EAN, Andrea spent much of her career working on natural resource public policy and coalition building in New England and nationally, focused on large-scale land conservation, sustainable forestry and energy. She worked on Vermont's first Comprehensive Energy Plan under Governor Madeleine Kunin, with the Biomass Energy Resource Center on community-scale biomass and atmospheric carbon research, as founding executive director of the Northern Forest Alliance, policy director of the Northern Forest Center, and deputy director of the Vermont Natural Resources Council. Andrea served as the policy leadership director for the Carsey Institute at the University of New Hampshire. **Steve Costello**, Vice President of the Generation and Energy Innovation at Green Mountain Power | Steve is responsible for generation operations and future development, as well as development of Green Mountain Power's Energy Innovation Center and Solar City Program in Rutland, Vt. Prior to that, he was Director of Public Affairs at Central Vermont Public Service.

Carl Deithelm, Student, Green Mountain College | Carl is a junior in the Renewable Energy and Ecological Design program at Green Mountain College where he works at the school's Sustainability Office as a Waste Diversion Specialist by taking recycling and food waste to the recycling dumpster and compost pile. Carl also works on personal projects that encourage environmental sustainability on campus with a focus on mitigating food waste. Projects include demonstrating how much food waste students throw away each week and creating incentives to reduce waste and starting a Food Recovery Network on campus to save pre-consumer food from the dining hall and distribute it to the community after the dining hall is done with it. design, permit, finance, and construct numerous solar PV projects throughout Vermont, including the largest rooftop solar arrays in Burlington, the first 500kW commercial group net metering project, and what is currently the largest solar array in Vermont. Chad is a developer, project manager and environmental engineer with over 20 years of professional experience in the fields of environmental engineering, professional project management and renewable energy project development. He holds a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from Bucknell University and an M.S. in Environmental Engineering from UVM.

Agriculture | In addition to his work with Extension, Joshua serves
as Adjunct Assistant Professor in the Department of Plant and Soil

Joshua holds a bachelor's degree in Biological Systems Engineering from Virginia Tech, and an M.S. and PhD from Cornell University in Biological and Environmental Engineering. In his role with Extension, he works to find successful adaptation practices for farmers and to make Vermont agriculture more resilient to climate change. He was raised on a beef farm in southern West Virginia, and currently lives in Starksboro, VT.

Gina Fiorile, Student, University of Vermont | Gina is a Sophomore Environmental Studies major at UVM. She is a lead organizer for the annual Vermont Youth Climate Summit and has worked as an intern at The Wild Center, the Natural History Museum of the Adirondacks, to develop the Youth Climate Summit Program. She is on the Board of Advisers at the Rubenstein School of Environment and Natural Resources and has been recognized as a Champion of Change for Climate Education and Literacy by the U.S. EPA and The White House.

Since then she has studied nature deficit disorder in children, severe weather in Vermont, oil in Ecuador, and teaches children of all ages about the environment in summer and afterschool programs. She recently travelled to some of the most biodiverse areas of Ecuador and is learning about the copper mining conflict in the Intag region, and starting a club at UVM to help combat this issue.

electric, thermal, and transportation efficiency. She was VEIC's first
Director of Transportation Efficiency where she developed and
oversaw the strategic direction for VEIC transportation efficiency
efforts as well as the development of a Transportation Efficiency
Utility. She served as the Director of the UVM National University
Transportation Center and interim co-director of the UVM TRC and
is the author of numerous publications including the annual
Vermont Transportation Energy Report. Previously she served as the
Vermont Clean Cities Coalition Coordinator, and held various
positions at the Agency of Transportation including Acting Secretary.
She is a member of the Vermont Bar and served as a member of the
Vermont House of Representatives from 1985-1990.

She has also been the editor of national magazines EatingWell, Audubon and Islands.

Christine Hallquist, Chief Executive Officer, Vermont
Electric Cooperative | VEC is a consumer-owned electric
distribution cooperative headquartered in Johnson that serves 34000
members. It has been a leader in the implementation of Smart Grid
technology, starting with its first smart meter installations in 2005.
Christine had been with VEC since 2000 and has served as its CEO
since 2005. Christine spent many years working on biomass
gasification technology for distributed generation. With her
leadership, VEC has been recognized nationally for technical
innovation. She is the Vice-Chair of Strategies and Technology for the
National Rural Electric Cooperative and serves on VELCO's board.

Nate Hausman, Project Manager, Clean Energy Group | In his role, Nate works primarily on solar policy. He is an attorney licensed to practice in California and Vermont. He previously served as an associate attorney for the Austin Legal Group and as a visiting attorney for the Environmental Law Institute. Nate sits on the Executive Committee of the Vermont Chapter of the Sierra Club and chairs of the Chapter's Energy Committee. Nate holds a J.D. with a certificate in Environmental & Natural Resources Law from Lewis & Clark Law School and a B.A. from Colorado College.

**John Hollar**, *Mayor*, *City of Montpelier* | John has been actively involved in Montpelier public life for many years. He has served as mayor since 2012, and he chaired the Montpelier school

board from 2002-2010. He helped lead the city in the adoption of Net Zero Montpelier, a policy under which all of the city's energy needs will be met or offset by renewable energy by 2030. John is a partner with the law firm Downs Rachlin Martin. He is an avid mountain biker and cross country skier.

Allison Hooper, Co-Founder/CEO, Vermont Creamery |
Allison started Vermont Creamery with Bob Reese on Don Hooper's hippie goat farm in 1984 when Americans didn't eat goat cheese.
She has been a pioneer in the American Artisan cheese movement, a leader is Sustainable and responsible business in Vermont and a mentor to young food entrepreneurs including her son Miles who manages the Ayers Brook Goat Dairy in Randolph Vermont.
Together Ayers Brook Goat Dairy and Vermont Creamery are developing the dairy goat industry in Vermont, transitioning the farm to non-gmo and reducing carbon along the way.

Mary Hooper, Vermont House of Representatives | Mary was born in Heidelberg, Germany, where her father was serving in the army. She has lived in Montpelier since 1979 with her husband, Jim Slinkman, a physicist working for IBM. She has been the executive director of the Vermont Association of Conservation Districts, Deputy Commissioner and Commissioner of the Department of Labor and Industry, and the first executive director of the Montpelier downtown association. She served four terms as Mayor of Montpelier and on a number of City Boards and Commissions and other organizations, including Capstone, the Hunger Council, and the Vermont College of Fine Arts.

Claire Humber, Director of Resort Planning & Design, SE Group | Claire has been with SE Group for 25 years and has led both large and small resort projects throughout Canada, the United States, Scandinavia, Iceland, Korea, and Japan. This breadth of experience and expertise allows her to understand the interconnectedness and specifics of a wide range of topics—from development trends to multi-season operations to guest services and branding. Claire helps resort operators and developers conceive, plan and bring to life ski and mountain resorts that balance customer delight and loyalty, distinctiveness, operational efficiency, and cost-effectiveness. **Kerrick Johnson**, *Vice President of Strategy and Communication, Vermont Electric Power Company* (*VELCO*) | Kerrick joined VELCO in 2006 to work on stakeholder relations as the company undertook the largest expansion in its history that ended with VELCO managing over \$1 billion in assets. He led VELCO's work to help secure the nation's only successful statewide smart grid project through a \$68 million DOE investment grant.
